Dear Ms O'Halloran

Re: My complaint about Fiona Seaton of Turner Freeman Lawyers

I thank you for and refer to your letter of 25th July 2017, which I received in yesterday's post.

In your letter, you state that it would be appreciated if I would limit any future comments to the conduct issue at hand, which you have emphasised by underlining such. I **attach** a copy of your letter.

For reference, I **attach** a copy of Fiona Seaton's letter to DG Thompson Lawyers of 17th February 2017, and Ms Seaton's letter to you of 26th June 2017, and my comments relating to such of 19th July 2017.

As you can see in Fiona Seaton's letter of 26th June 2017, Ms Seaton again makes a large number of serious accusations and allegations, and to which, I, quite understandably, and quite rightly, provide an explanation as to why such allegations are demonstrably untrue.

You sought my comments in relation to Ms Seaton's letter of 26th June 2017, and I provided such comments, and now, it seems, you are attempting to curtail my responses. This is hardly unbiased behaviour on your part, nor is it acceptable.

Please advise me if I am incorrect, however, my original complaints about Fiona Seaton were in respect to Ms Seaton making serious false accusations and allegations of criminal conduct against me in her letter of 17th February 2017 to DG Thompson Lawyers.


Ms Seaton repeats those allegations in her letter of 26th June 2017, without providing any documentary evidence, as well as adding additional allegations. Surely, and obviously, my

letter of 19th July 2017 relates directly to the complaint I made in the first instance, being false allegations made against me by Ms Seaton.

Furthermore, my letter of 19th July 2017, in dealing directly with the above, shines a clear light on serious conduct issues regarding the behaviours and conduct of another solicitor at Turner Freeman Lawyers, whom Fiona Seaton names directly in her letters of 17th February 2017 and 26th June 2017, including apparent fraudulent conduct and the apparent misleading of the Court; and to which you have ostensibly turned your head in the other direction.
